Con proposed that replicate wines are not required and AWRI use the wines in AWRI roadshow events and contribute \$5,500 towards trial costs.</li> <li>Previous minute: The new incubator post doc student using the rootstock trial as part of the project. Limited budget and will utilise the wines made to analyse the wines for potassium and looking at what is influencing. Saving money on not making wine the student can analyse all rootstocks and looking at other factors. He noted he didn't want acid adjustments. Note this could be a timing of sample collections.</li> </ul>
4.10	<ul> <li>Vine Improvement</li> <li>No progress and maintain the following as standing item until further scope and budget allocated.</li> <li>Previous minute: Coonawarra Cabernet Clone Project to be scoped for further consideration. Why? To hold onto some old Coonawarra vines and could be promotional. Characteristic value and chosen for flavour, disease resistance and other such factors.</li> <li>Note there is a commercial CW44 clone available from most nurseries. Identified from clonal evaluations of Cirami, McCarthy and Nicholas (1993) however, compared under Nurioopta conditions. Other vines that came out of theses initial trials (1960- 80s) trial included the LC10, LC7, LC9 to mention a few through the big clonal trial and they assessed in region and took the superior clones.</li> </ul>
